
"Its tough being special. Once you're special you're always going to be special and there's nothing you can do about it. So, you gotta be tough." This is the advice Elliot's favorite Aunt Carmen gives him at a young age as he watches his mother throw her life away with one loser boyfriend after another. Wise beyond his years, Elliot, the boy, tells his story from his sanctuary behind a closed bathroom door. This delightful film chronicles the life of Elliot, a smart, irresistibly cute Dominican kid as he transitions from boy to man. In flashbacks that work beautifully through a tightly woven story peppered with strong dialogue and great characters, director Terracino's story is sincere and full of hope as Elliot, the man, navigates the familiar themes of family loyalty, the quest for love and the bittersweet heartbreak of coming of age.



Travis Mathews, 2012, USA, 71 min

Blending angst-ridden introspection with playful pornographic entanglement, director Travis Mathews (In Their Room) captures your interest in the life of a man whose creative energy has gone stagnant and titillates you with the playful sex lives of his more engaging friends. I Want Your Love follows Jesse's last day in San Francisco before he moves back to Columbus, Ohio for a fresh start. While he plods his way through the agonizing conflict of leaving cool friends in a cool city to return to a borrowed room in his father's house, his friends plan and throw him a party. Jesse can't get into the spirit of things but his friends find ample distraction to lighten the load. And they do lighten their loads in *graphic* detail — real men enjoying real sex.

JOSHUA TREE, 1951: A PORTRAIT OF JAMES DEAN

Matthew Mishory, 2012, USA, 94 min

Writer/Director Matthew Mishory paints a gorgeous portrait of the legendary screen icon using stunning cinematography and the stark desert landscape of Joshua Tree, California. According to this version of the biography, it is here where James Dean spent time and it offered the perfect backdrop for a mega star about to explode into the world and a young man grappling with his sexuality and hungry for adventure. The story articulates what has long been speculated — that James Dean was gay, or at least bisexual. The nostalgic feel of the film is extraordinary and successfully portrays the look of Hollywood films in 1951. Dean is played by relatively unknown actor, James Preston, who oozes sexuality while humming innocence. Joshua Tree, 1951 will ignite the flames of controversy around the question, "Was he or wasn't he?"

Macky Alston, 2012, USA, 83 min

Bishop Gene Robinson made history in 2003 when he became the first openly gay bishop in the Anglican Communion. His appointment by the Diocese of the New Hampshire within the Episcopal Church of the United States set off an explosion of worldwide controversy in the Anglican Communion. The decision was so controversial that in 2008, he was the only bishop in the world who was not invited to the Anglicans' Lambeth Conference of bishops. That decision was just as contentious as Bishop Robinson's ordination. Bishop Barbara Harris, the first female Anglican bishop, said of the Lambeth, "If assholes could fly, this place would be an airport." This film candidly chronicles the controversy of the "gay bishop" as it bares the soul of Bishop Robinson and the fractured church to which he devoted his life's work.

"Rapunzel has a friend named, Pascal. He is a chameleon." Those are the words of seven year old, Danon, a confident, loveable transgendered little girl. When spoken by Danon, the words are an incredibly powerful testament to her journey. As she puts it, "Sometimes you have to live two lives." Trans tells the story of the most incredible transformation as told by parents, grandparents, siblings, significant others and the courageous individuals who are living the journey. Transgendered adults, youth and children share their lives with candor and sincerity. This must see film by writer/director, Chris Arnold, beautifully melds stories of the medical and emotional metamorphosis from chameleon to liberation.

Chino and Anaylis are Cuban. They are also deaf. They have two small children and struggle to make ends meet. And Chino has a boyfriend, José, from Mexico, who financially supports Chino and his family. Anaylis is not only supportive of the relationship, she is counting on José's continued affection for Chino as a means to find a better life for her and her children. Exquisitely perfect photography and a fascinating story that draws you in cause this film to play more like a narrative than a documentary. And the most curious thing happens. As soon as we stop trying to unravel the hidden agendas, we start to care about what happens to the people in this most curious story of family and survival.



Ah, the angst and insecurities of budding womanhood — exciting, scary and confusing. High school sucks - and it rocks. Just depends on the girl at your side. Director Aurora Guerrero brings us this impressive first feature about the plight of first generation immigrants and two teenage girls. The clash of culture, social status and hormones is the backdrop for an intense story of friendship, love and sexual awakening. It is difficult to carry the dreams of your family on your shoulders with your head in the clouds. Crashing to earth amidst the gritty reality of life and love, two young women find their way in this compelling coming of age experience. Relayed in both English and Spanish, Guerrero weaves the language of family into a seamless experience that brings us into the lives of young lovers separated by circumstances and united in exploration.

Ernst and Tobias are the most likeable couple on the block. Ernst is strikingly hand-some, buttoned up and responsible. Tobias is cute, cuddly and outrageously creative. Together, they light up the screen. Ah, but tranquil lovebirds alone don't tell a fun story. Enter Uta, the vilest character since Cruella de Ville tried to chop up those cute, little Dalmatians. Uta is Ernst's best friend and upon her arrival, she begins to immediately implement her evil agenda — to end the happy couple and keep Ernst for herself. As chaotic as things get, Ernst and Tobias keep us grounded solidly in the notion that true love conquers all. Men to Kiss is a crazy, volatile jaunt of friendship, mayhem and madness with a soft landing that sends you home smiling.

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

Jon Garcia, 2012, USA, 89 min

It is the love for Jesus Christ that compels RJ Smith to leave his family and his girl-friend to accept a two-year mission with the Church of Latter Day Saints (the Mormon Church). It is the love for Elder Chris Merril that unravels his mission, in a painfully slow and beautifully natural fashion. But it is the love he finds for himself, claiming his sexuality in the face of his family and his church, that sets him free. Director Jon Garcia presents his film in the simplest of terms, almost as if we are eavesdropping as two people slowly peel away the facades that protect them while hiding them from the truth of their hearts.

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
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
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## **FESTIVAL JURY:**
