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

All Access Festival Pass: \$125 Allows access to both in person and virtual films. Only need one per household for Virtual events and films. (For in person events and films, passes admit only one.) NOTE: When attending in-person, bring your pass either on your phone or your printed copy to the venues, and you will be able to purchase one additional ticket for your guest for \$8.

USING THE EVENTIVE PLATFORM:

Passes are linked to the email that you use to purchase and to create your Eventive sign-in. You will receive an email to set up your account. Check spam if you don't see it.

The pass allows you to unlock a film one time.

After you unlock a film or a shorts program, please note the amount of time you have to push play on that particular film. Once you push play you will have 24 hours to complete the screening. Films will be available to stream on your personal computer, on your mobile device, or on your home entertainment system via Apple TV, Roku, or a Smart TV enabled with AirPlay or Chromecast and now Amazon Fire TV, or Amazon Fire Stick.





LANGUAGE LESSONS

Florida-native Natalie Morales (known for her roles in many TV shows such as Parks and Recreation, Girls, and Dead To Me and feature films such as Battle of the Sexes, Stuber and The Little Things) directs this charming feature film that she stars in alongside Mark Duplass, her co-writer, to tell a story that is extremely timely and and underscores the importance of human connection in this technologically isolating time. Mark Duplass (known for his roles in such TV shows as *The League* and *The Morning Show* as well as feature movies like Bombshell, Tully, and The One I Love) finally makes all of our dreams come true playing a gay man in this film. (His last flirtation with gueerdom was in Humpday where he played a straight man dared to star in a porn film with his equally straight friend played by Josh Leonard). In this film Mark Duplass's character, Adam, receives a surprise birthday present from his husband in the form of online Spanish language lessons taught by Natalie Morales' character, Cariño, who is video conferencing in from Central America. During their series of weekly sessions they strike up an unexpected and meaningful friendship. Shot during the pandemic in both Los Angeles and Costa Rica, the story takes place entirely on computer screens but the engaging performances by Natalie and Mark take us on an emotionally cinematic journey. After premiering this year at the Berlin Film Festival and winning Audience Awards at Provincetown and SXSW, Natalie's film comes to her home state to kick off TIGLFF.

Antonio is a 30-year-old family man, whose life finds an unexpected twist when he's suddenly dumped by his husband, on whom he depends both psychologically and economically. Antonio rents a room in an apartment and starts to work in a bakery while attending pastry school. With new friends and a renewed purpose in life, he realizes his past error of giving up his independence for the sake of his relationship. However, when a new guy comes along and tempts him to give it all up again, he questions whether he can have his cake and eat it too. This insightful film is an Italian feast for the soul with plenty of delicious eye-candy.

Screen legend Cloris Leachman gives a masterful final starring performance in this bittersweet family drama as an old woman in rural Prince Edward County, Ontario, whose mental and physical decline means she may soon be moved to a nursing home. Into her uncertain future comes her wayward grandson who is himself a bit at loose ends. Reeling from a recent breakup and struggling to make ends meet as a budding drag queen named Fishy Falters, he has shown up on his grandmother's doorstep to retrieve a car she had promised him years ago. He lingers to care for her, however, and soon discovers that this may well be the place to finally put down roots.

Mervi and Kata, a lesbian couple living in Helsinki, are considering coming out of the closet but when they visit Mervi's hometown and family, all hell breaks loose. Everybody's a hypocrite and nobody's opinion is spared in this equal opportunity satire in which a family of queer-friendly, multi-cultural liberals are trapped inside their house by a mob of neo-Nazis outside. Loyalties are tested, promises are broken, and secrets are revealed as the hostages begin to turn on each other in a microcosm of the world's conflicting viewpoints and prejudice. Veering wildly from farcical humor to moments of sincere revelation, Finland's take on the "Not in my backyard" phenomenon is like Jolo Rabbit meets The Birdcage.



This playfully provocative documentary tells the story of San Francisco's beloved Gay All-Male Revue of the same name. BALONEY's co-creators, Michael and Rory, invite their collaborators and audiences to embrace the sexualized aspects of striptease and burlesque alongside a blend of fantasy, confession, and social commentary. The cast proves to be a motley crew of folks - which includes a woman and at least one straight ally - and the stories they tell about their lives prior to working in the show are fascinating and unforgettable.

BETWEEN THEM (TOUTES LES DEUX)

This tongue-in-cheek homage to spy thrillers and screwball comedies follows a lesbian private eye who is hired by a desperately jealous Russian professor to follow his wife who he is convinced is cheating on him. Having to travel to Montreal for the stakeout, she must sleep in her car since most hotels in Montreal were closed during lockdown. The rule-breaking detective complicates the case further when she develops a strong attraction to her masked target and decides to seduce her while giving her client the runaround. Shot during the pandemic, the film integrates the lais-sez-faire rules into the background of the film without addressing it directly.

NORA HIGHLAND

Based on out-actor Ryan Spahn's play of the same name and shot entirely on computers during the Covid-19 Pandemic, this peek into showbiz politics follows the casting process of a notable gay character in an upcoming Broadway revival. Mirroring reality, the film explores the problematic phenomenon of straight performers being lauded for their work in queer roles. To date 50+ straight/cis actors have been nominated for Oscars for playing queer characters. Just this year two straight performers were Oscar-nominated for playing queer roles while there were ZERO queer performers nominated. Only one queer actor has ever been nominated for doing the same...that was lan McKellen.

Based on the late Sergey Fetisov's memoir "The Story of Roman," this tragic romance tells the story of star-crossed lovers who have the supreme misfortune of falling into a relationship during the height of the Cold War in the Soviet Union, where someone is always looking over your shoulder and sexual relations between two men is punished with five years' hard labor. Sergey is a private in the Soviet army who is at the tail-end of his service and has hopes of becoming an actor. Lieutenant Roman Medveyev is a fighter pilot who has just been transferred to the Air Force Base. The two of them share a passion for the arts when they take a trip to see Stravinsky's "Firebird" and a passion for each other.

When two generations of Israeli women fall for a German and a Palestinian, chaos follows in this romantic misadventure crossing all borders. After a string of casual ex-girlfriends, Shira, a flamboyant Israeli restauranteur, finally finds her soul mate in Maria, a quiet, resolute German woman who has uprooted entirely just to be with her in Tel Aviv. Shira's headstrong, critical grandmother, Berta, openly disapproves of their relationship, yet is secretly involved with her Palestinian neighbor, Ibrahim. Their attempts to bridge cultures and navigate family mishigas while planning a wedding fuel a lot of "rompcom" hilarity but also generate moments that bravely confront emotional wounds of the past.

POTATO DREAMS OF AMERICA

Wes Hurley's autobiographical dark comedy about growing up gay in the Soviet Union and emigrating to America with his mail-order bride mother is divided into two strikingly different halves featuring two different pairs of actors playing the nick-named Potato and his mother. His childhood in Russia is portrayed like a vintage sitcom where the characters all have American accents, including his grandmother (played by an almost unrecognizable Lea DeLaria.) His teenage years in America living with his strict stepfather are portrayed more realistically and the characters speak in broken English with Russian accents. It's an artistic choice that helps breathe new life into a familiar genre and makes it one of the most memorable coming out stories in recent memory.

GLOB LESSONS

Move over Felix and Oscar, the latest odd couple is Alan and Jesse, two mismatched strangers who are paired together by a children's theater company to perform low-budget productions of *Robin Hood* and *A Christmas Carol* in elementary schools. Alan (played by Colin Froeber) is a partially closeted, insecure gay man from Minnesota who is reserved, fastidious, and takes his dramatic artform very seriously. Jesse (played by Nicole Rodenburg) is a boisterous, spontaneous and outspoken thespian from West Virginia who is more comfortable improvising her life. Their plays are as far from Off-Broadway as you can get when their tour takes them in a minivan across the desolate snowy highways of the upper-Midwest states while staying in depressing motel rooms with the howling wind outside. Along the way they break the ice and begin to confess their present insecurities, confront their past demons and try to salvage their fading dreams for the future. This is a strikingly accomplished, beautifully crafted, and confidently directed first feature from Nicole Rodenburg, whose life-long BFF Colin Froeber co-wrote the script and produced the film with her, basing much of the story on their own experiences in theater. As expected from this dynamic duo, the acting is impeccable and so is their comedic timing in this quirky and endearing road trip buddy movie.

BUILDING A BRIDGE

Horrified by Catholic leaders' silence in the wake of the Pulse nightclub massacre, Father James Martin writes a widely-acclaimed book and tours the country speaking with the news media, local parishes and LGBTQ+ Catholics with his message of "compassion, respect, and sensitivity." Meanwhile, Father Martin faces vicious attacks from his most vocal opponent, Michael Voris and his "altright media empire," Church Militant. Voris is a repentant Catholic with a "sinful" past who organizes protests and social media campaigns against Father Martin. Despite the online attacks and his own personal struggles, Father Martin reaches hundreds of thousands of people with his message across the country and world.

As the ACT UP/LA spokesperson in early 90's Los Angeles, Connie Norman stood proudly in her multiple, fluid and evolving LGBTQ identities, even as she stared her own mortality in the face being HIV positive. Connie's soulful and salty rantings and intersectional politics were heard widely through her newspaper column, and pioneering radio and cable TV talk shows. Serving as a bridge in both gender and politics, and modeling "wokeness" in an early era of crisis, Connie's piercing and compassionate voice urges us again into action, to fully engage with our lives and our world.

Ric Weiland was another critical activist during the height of the AIDS epidemic. Rather than being the exuberant megaphone that Connie Norman was, Ric Weiland was notoriously shy but nonetheless put his money where his mouth was in an era where funding was (and continues to be) a critical component of the fight to effect change. A tech wizard who was hired by Bill Gates in the early days of Microsoft, Ric initially lead the kind of charmed life that was afforded a young, handsome man of wealth. After testing positive for HIV, however, his priorities changed, and he donated millions of dollars to LGBTQ+ charities and is often regarded as the first great gay philanthropist.


WORKHORSE QUEEN
