
2019 Distinguished Friend of the Festival Award: Mark & Roger

It is a celebration of perseverance, bravery, and of the life experiences that unite us. At the heart of the film is classic observational footage, shot both by cinematographers and the director, over a three year shoot period. And the result, having premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival, is a universal story, visually appealing and gripping from start to finish.

A song lang is a percussion instrument used to control tempo and phrasing in Vietnamese modern folk opera. In the Vietnamese language, it also means "two men." It is the perfect homonym for a nearly perfect film.

History Matters... The Gay Men's Chorus of Tampa Bay





Looking back, it is difficult to pin down exactly who had the idea, first. Depending on who you ask, the festival was born out of a way to extend the Tampa Pride celebrations happening in October; or it was a way to raise funds for LGBT groups, especially for AIDS support organizations. Most agree that the festival was organized by members of the Tampa Bay Gay Men's Chorus and the Tampa Bay Business Guild. Those organizations had a few people in common and they emerged as leaders of the first festival committee. Within a couple of years, Crescendo, the Tampa Bay Womyn's Chorus was created and joined the efforts. Eventually, the festival evolved into an entity unto itself and the Tampa International Gay and Lesbian Film Festival (TIGLFF) was formed under a non-profit organization, Friends of the Festival.

Today, TIGLFF is the oldest, most consistent LGBT event in the Tampa Bay area. The groups that started the festival have all folded, some for good. Others have re-emerged with different names and missions. There are people in attendance, this year, who can tell their versions of the challenges, the victories, the scandals and the healing that is the history of TIGLFF. In their stories, one theme will emerge. TIGLFF is still around because of the hundreds of people through the years that stepped out and held on tight to the notion that LGBT stories matter; and those stories deserve to be told. People gave of their time, their money, their sweat and their tears – literally – to keep TIGLFF alive.

Listing names is a tricky business. We might leave someone out and with no malice at all, hurt their feelings. But we would be remiss, if we didn't at least try to acknowledge those early visionaries. Names like, Mark Puig, Keith Roberts, Jim Harper, Joe Lonsway, Dorothy Abbot, Kathie Michael, Sunny Hall, Bob Pope, Victoria Jorgenson and Amy Nestor.

Through the years, people have continued to step up, keeping TIGLFF alive and thriving. Today, TIGLFF is served by a working board, most of whom have been involved at different levels for many years. Ed Lally, Mariruth Kennedy, Rob Akins, Sunny Hall, Sam Salmons, Ben Tozour and Santiago Echeverry. Programming is the most important function of any film festival. Dorothy Abbott set that bar decades ago. For the past seven years, KJ Mohr has raised that bar. And for fifteen years, Renee Cossette, has been the Festival Director and the consistent anchor of TIGLFF. Even with all that talent, TIGLFF would have not survived without the hundreds of volunteers who keep showing up night after night, year after year. Ty Maxey and Tim Thomas are the captains of those efforts and true heroes of TIGLFF. Finally, nothing gets done without paying the bills. Donors, sponsors, public and private funders continue to keep the reels turning with their generous support.

The Tampa Bay LGBT community should be proud of what it has accomplished in creating something that has courageously endured for thirty years. In this age of streaming and "on-demand" programming, it is still a magical experience to sit in the dark with a bucket of popcorn and share a story with our friends. It is not just a movie. It is a place to reunite with old friends and to find new connections with like-minded people. Thanks to TIGLFF for the memories. Keep them coming.

The San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus set out to bring their message of hope and resiliency in response to the 2016 presidential election by spending a week touring throughout the deep south.

The Chorus, joined by The Oakland Interfaith Gospel Choir, brought a message of music, love, and acceptance to communities and individuals confronting intolerance. Over 300 singers travelled from Mississippi to Tennessee, through the Carolinas, and over the bridge in Selma. They performed in churches, community centers and concert halls in hopes of uniting us in a time of difference. The journey also challenged Director Tim Seeleg and other Chorus members who fled the South to confront their own fears, pain, and prejudices, on a journey towards reconciliation. The conversations and connections that emerge offer a glimpse of a less divided America, where the things that divide us - faith, politics, sexual identity - are set aside by the soaring power of music, humanity, and a little drag.

There is beautiful vocal performance in this movie. But there is much more than singing to this thoughtful documentary that chronicles a journey that began as a challenge to the oppression of the deep south and ended in the delight of southern people steeped in their love of gospel music and hungry for conversation. This remarkable film demonstrates that, clearly, there is a whole lot of fixing that singing can do.
